Your natural gas bill includes:

- Firm Gas Sales Service – the costs to buy and supply natural gas
- Residential Distribution Service – the costs to maintain our gas system and deliver gas to your home

### Firm Gas Sales Service (FS-1)

Administrative charge	\$0.0250 per therm
Natural gas service**	
- Summer (Apr. 1 - Oct. 31)	\$0.8573 per therm
- Winter (Nov. 1 - Mar. 31)	\$0.8888 per therm

### Residential Distribution Service (RD-1)

Customer charge	\$0.3124 per day
Distribution service	\$0.2303 per therm

\*\*Subject to adjustment for the cost of purchased gas.

**Customer Charge:** Every customer receives this charge whether or not natural gas or electricity is used.

# Residential Services and Prices

## Basic Utility Rates

Effective Jan. 1, 2007

We take seriously our responsibility to provide reliable energy and control costs. Before setting new rates, the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin reviews our rate request and listens to customers and MGE.

### Why are MGE electric prices going down?

Natural gas prices impact your electric bill. The demand for cleaner electric power has made natural gas a key part of electricity's fuel mix.

The new electric rate is lower because of a drop in natural gas supply prices. In recent years, MGE has increased electric rates to pay for new infrastructure (power plants, substations, etc.) to reliably meet our customers' growing energy demands. The retreat from last year's high natural gas supply prices has offset these new infrastructure costs.

### Why are MGE natural gas rates unchanged?

Natural gas distribution service rates cover gas system maintenance and the costs to deliver gas to your home. They are independent of gas supply prices. Supply prices (found under gas sales service rates) may go up or down with monthly market fluctuations. The current lower gas supply costs will be reflected on your bill. These prices are filed monthly with the Public Service Commission.

### How can I control my costs?

While you don't have control over energy prices, you do have control over your energy use. You can now track your energy use and see how your home heating costs compare online at [mge.com](http://mge.com). Consider these tips to control costs:

- Adjust your thermostat setting at night and when you are away.
- Replace your incandescent lightbulbs with compact fluorescent bulbs.
- Look for the ENERGY STAR® label when purchasing new appliances and equipment.

### Residential Electric Service (Rg-1)

Most residential customers use these rates.

### Residential Electric Time-of-Use (Rg-2)

Can you use less than 35% of your electricity on-peak - from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.? If so, this rate may save you money. Call 252-7222 to discuss before you change to this rate.

This service is mandatory for customers with average daily use of 130 kWh or more during the summer billing season.

### Residential-Controlled Water Heating (Rw-1)

An option if you have an electric water heater. In exchange for lower rates, your water heater is placed on a separate meter and a special timer to control when it operates. The charge for an electrician to install the meter and timer can cost you several hundred dollars.
