

# Annual Statement of Public Benefit Fees and Programs

Your electric bill includes a monthly fee for the Public Benefits Fund, which was established to help reduce energy use in Wisconsin. This fee appears on your electric bill as a “non-taxable customer service charge.” During the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2006, Madison Gas and Electric provided a total of \$3,761,940.03 from residential and non-residential customers in support of Public Benefits programs.

The Wisconsin Public Benefits Fund supports four programs under the “Focus on Energy” umbrella: 1) Business, 2) Residential, 3) Renewable and 4) Environmental Research.

The Focus on Energy Business program works with industries, commercial enterprises, agricultural producers, schools and local governments to identify areas where energy can be used more efficiently.

The Residential programs are designed to address every aspect of home energy efficiency, from building an energy-efficient home to purchasing energy-efficient appliances and lighting for the home.

The Renewable Energy Program focuses on five market segments including: solar electric on existing homes; solar water heating for large volume users; customer-owned rural commercial wind; large dairy farm biogas systems; and thermal bioenergy from bioenergy wastes.

The Environmental Research Program funds research on the impact of electrical energy generation and transmission on Wisconsin's natural environment.
