



Commercial and Industrial Lighting and Power Service

AVAILABILITY

To any commercial customer using single-phase, 60-cycle alternating current for lighting, heating, and small motors (individual motors 7.5 horsepower or less) and all other appliances (including ranges) which do not interfere with lighting service; and for combined lighting and three-phase, 60-cycle, alternating current power service provided the single-phase load is distributed between the phases so that it will not unbalance the current per phase more than 10 percent. **This rate schedule is closed to new customers as of January 1, 2010.**

The order in Docket 3270-UR-11 gave customers served on the Cg-1 Level B rate the option of being served on the Cg-1 Level A rate. This option ran out on March 2, 1984. Customers who chose to be served on Cg-1 Level A have the option of remaining on the Cg-1 Level A rate or transferring to the Cg-5 rate at any time unless the customer's demand exceeds 20 kW. Once the customer transfers from Cg-1 Level A to Cg-5, the Cg-1 Level A rate is closed to this customer. Any Cg-5 customer choosing to be served on the Cg-1 Level A rate thereby waives all rights to any billing adjustments arising from a claim that the bill for the customer's service would be cheaper on Level 1 of this rate schedule for any period of time, including any rights under Wis. Admin. Code § PSC 113.0406(4), Reg. January 2004, No. 577.

RATE

Level A

Applies to all customers whose demand is greater than 20 kW and less than or equal to 75 kW.

Level B

Applies to all customers whose demand is greater than 75 kW and less than or equal to 200 kW.

- Summer rates are effective from June 1 through September 30. Winter rates are all times of the year other than the defined summer season.
- Level A rates will apply to customers if the customer's demand exceeds 20 kW in at least four out of 12 months. Level B rates will apply to customers if the customer's demand exceeds 75 kW in at least four out of 12 months.
- A new customer initiating service under this rate schedule with less than an estimated or actual demand of 50 kW will initially be placed on Cg-5 until the customer's demand exceeds the required demand for Level A or Level B in at least four out of 12 months. New customers initiating service under this rate schedule with an estimated or actual demand of 50 kW or greater will initially be placed on Level A until the customer's demand exceeds 75 kW in at least four out of 12 months. Once a customer qualifies for Level A or Level B, the customer will be billed at that respective level until the customer's demand is less than the minimum demand for the respective level for 12 consecutive months.

PAYMENT

Payment is due not later than the due date shown on the bill. Any Company billing charges unpaid after the due date will be subject to a late payment charge as described in the Company's electric service rules under Late Payment Charge.



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MINIMUM MONTHLY CHARGE

The minimum monthly charge will be the customer charge plus the demand charge for the customer maximum 15-minute demand.

DETERMINATION OF DEMAND

All demand will be measured by demand meters except as provided herein. The maximum monthly 15-minute demand will be the greatest rate at which electrical energy has been used during any period of 15 consecutive minutes in the billing month. Demand meters will not be installed for customers whose connected load or monthly use of service is such that the measured demand would not exceed 20 kW.

The customer maximum 15-minute demand will be the greatest rate at which electrical energy has been used during any period of 15 consecutive minutes in the current or preceding 11 billing months.

PRIMARY DISCOUNT PROVISION

Available to customers not served by the low-voltage network.

1. For delivery at:
 - a. 2,400 volts or 4,160 volts as available to customers with demands of 200 kW or more.
 - b. 13,800 volts where available to customers with demands of 500 kW or more.

2. For customers qualifying under No. 1.a. and 1.b. who provide the transformers and associated equipment necessary for converting the available primary service to the secondary voltage required by the customer.

\$0.00328 per kW per day of billed customer demand
3. Customers taking service at primary voltage will provide all the necessary delivery, control, and regulating facilities on the load side of the transformers.

SPECIAL TERMS AND PROVISIONS

Customers who have their meters turned off and back on within a 12-month period will pay the minimum monthly charges, applicable to the customer, for the months while service was not being used.
